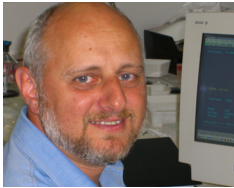


SENIOR SCIENTIFIC STAFF

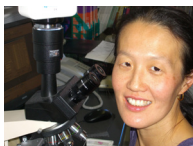
Supervising Pathologist DR SUZANNE DANIELETTO MBBS (Hons), BSc, FRCPA

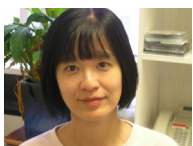
Anatomical Pathologist DR BANUMATHY BANUTHEVAN MBBS(Hons) MD FRCPA.
