Admissions and Bookings



San Pre-admission Forms

The Pre-Admission Booklet should be provided to the patient by the referring doctor. Patients can also download the full booklet or individual forms at <u>sah.org.au/your-admission</u>. Patients must complete their admission forms prior to their hospital stay. Online completion is preferred (<u>https://sah.eadmissions.org.au</u>), during which patients can also upload consent forms and other documents, but paper forms can be posted, delivered to the front desk or faxed to 9480 9935.

San Surgical Bookings

Online Hospital Bookings is the preferred method for doctors' practices to book all elective procedures, although bookings can currently still be submitted on the paper Hospital Booking Letter (HBL) via fax or email. All bookings must have signed consent attached.

All surgical bookings are confirmed with the doctor's rooms – patients do not need to confirm these. Should cancellations occur, it is vital that doctors' rooms notify the appropriate department as soon as possible. Please consult the SAH Theatre Bookings Process document for more detail.

Ensure that all surgical bookings include an urgency category:

1 (surgery necessary within 30 days), 2 (surgery necessary within 90 days), 3 (surgery advised within 365 days).

Equipment needs & new procedures

Ensure that any special equipment required is detailed on the booking. Surgical equipment or devices not previously been used at the hospital, or requested for an off-label indication, are subject to review and approval, and early notification is required. If the required Prosthesis is not listed on the register then an 'ex gratia application' is required through the Prosthesis Coordinator on 9480 9534.

Surgical procedures not previously performed at SAH need approval by the Medical Advisory Committee prior to booking. Contact Medical Services to enquire about the application process.

Online Hospital Bookings

Our electronic booking system enables doctors and their practice staff to submit and manage bookings and theatre lists in real time. A San project manager will visit your practice to train your staff to use the software. Contact Allison Penman to organise set-up at Allison.Penman@sah.org.au

Pre-Admission Clinic (PAC)

PAC is located within the Surgical Centre on Level 4 of the Clark Tower. Appointments for pre-operative tests +/- consultation with an anaesthetist can be made up to three weeks prior to surgery by phoning 9480 9115. All patients having orthopaedic joint replacements must attend at least 10 days before surgery for screening.

Admission times

Most patients are admitted on the day of surgery and are notified the night before by nursing staff. If special work-up is required prior to surgery, arrangements may be made through the booking office. Transfers from other facilities should occur on the day prior to procedures at SAH as the Ambulance Service cannot guarantee urgent transport. Transfers must be arranged through the After Hours Manager on 0414 879 432.

Admissions and Bookings



Emergency or additional procedures

Same day emergency or additional procedures must be booked through the Theatre Floor Supervisor on 0416 093 765. Emergency category (1-5) and any ICU bed requirements must be advised when booking. Surgeon, anaesthetist and theatre availability will be discussed and a suitable timeframe organised.

Workers Compensation Patients

These must be approved by the insurance company before admission. The doctor must receive approval for themselves and the hospital, and send the approval to Hospital Bookings (fax 9480 9935 or accesscentre@sah.org.au).

Public Liability/Third Party Patients

These must be cleared by the Patient Services Department before admission (9480 9903 [option 1] or <u>accesscentre@sah.org.au</u>). All anticipated hospital costs must be paid in advance.

Veterans' Affairs Patients

The doctor must get approval from the Department of Veterans' Affairs (9213 7419) prior to admission for White Card holders. Gold Card holders do not need approval.

Transfers from other hospitals

The hospital must accept the booking, and a health fund check must be attended to before a patient is transferred from another facility.

SDSH Surgical Bookings

All surgical bookings are confirmed by SDSH with the doctor's rooms. Should cancellations occur, it is vital that doctors' rooms notify the Day Surgery as soon as possible.

SDSH Pre-Admission Booklet and forms

The Pre-Admission Booklet should be provided to the patient by the referring doctor. The doctor must complete the Hospital Booking letter and consent, which should be emailed to <u>sandaysurgeryhornsby@sah.org.au</u> as soon as the booking is made. Patients must complete their admission and patient history forms prior to their hospital stay. Online completion is preferred, via <u>www.sandaysurgery.com.au</u>. Paper forms can be emailed, posted, or delivered to the front desk.

Admission times

All patients are admitted on the day of surgery, and are notified of arrival time between 3 and 5pm the day before by our staff.

Emergency or additional procedures

Appropriate additional procedures must be organised through the SDSH NUM on 0408 309 970. Surgeon, anaesthetist and theatre availability will be discussed and a suitable timeframe organised.

Medical Staff and Rosters



Accredited Medical Officers (AMOs)

AHCL is committed to clinician engagement including involvement in clinical governance. The Medical Advisory Committee (MAC) holds a very important role in the organisation.

At SAH the chairperson of the MAC is on the Board of Directors, to ensure that the Board is kept abreast of the priorities of clinicians. SAH has two Divisions: Surgical Services and Medicine, and one cross functional service, Cancer Services, each with a Clinical Director, whose role is to work closely with hospital management to continually improve services for patients and clinicians. Heads of Departments attend Divisional meetings to bring forward issues or ideas from clinicians in their specialty. Each department holds regular meetings, as well as Morbidity and Mortality meetings.

We invite all doctors to raise any issues and ideas with their Head of Department, Divisional Clinical Director or a MAC member. Names of the representatives for the MAC, Divisions and Departments can be found on Pulse, the hospital's intranet, on the Doctors Information page. At San Day Surgery Hornsby (SDSH), the MAC members are the key medical representatives and all clinicians working at SDSH are invited to raise issues or ideas with the Head of Department or a MAC member. The SDSH MAC reports to the Board of Directors through the operational leadership team.

AMOs at both SAH and SDSH have responsibilities to the hospital with respect to accreditation, conduct, patient care, and medical documentation, which are detailed in the *By-Laws for Medical Officers and Visiting Health Practitioners, and the Policies and Protocols for Doctors* located on the Doctors Information page on Pulse, the hospital's intranet.

Medical Staff and Rosters



Career Medical Officers (CMOs)

The Career Medical Officer (CMO) staff at SAH are available to assist with urgent and emergent clinical care in wards and intensive care, and may assist with certain other aspects of inpatient care in response to requests by the AMOs.

CMOs are available to liaise with AMOs regarding assessment of a patient's medical condition in circumstances where it is not possible for the AMO to attend. However in a private hospital, the primary and final responsibility for patient care rests with the admitting and attending AMOs.

CMOs cover a large number of wards and thus cannot function in the same way as a Resident Medical Officer (RMO) in a public hospital who is allocated to a specialty. Therefore, "routine" ward tasks such as writing up medication orders, completing consent forms for blood transfusion and writing discharge summaries should be performed by the Admitting Medical Officer.

Two ward CMOs are rostered on day and night shifts; with each CMO allocated to a particular list of wards. See Key Contacts (on page 4) for CMO pager numbers.

Interns & Registrars

SAH hosts a small number of interns (on rotation from NSW Prevocational Training Network 6 (Hornsby & Northern Beaches) and registrars in limited specialties, which may vary according to government funding. Because of the limited numbers of junior medical officers, interns and registrars are allocated to nominated clinical supervisors for their rotations, rather than all specialists within the rotation. If your specialty is hosting interns and registrars, discuss with your Head of Department or Medical Services regarding their training and supervision arrangements.

Rosters

Most specialties participate in on-call rosters. Participating departments have an allocated roster writer who communicates with Medical Services (9480 9400 or <u>medadmin@sah.org.au</u>). On-call rosters can be found on *Pulse*, the hospital's intranet. Self-rostering is available to certain specialties such as Anaesthetists (via Hosportal) and Surgical Assistants (via SmartAppoint). For further information on rosters please contact the Head of Department or Medical Services.

Medical Informatics

SAH is one of the most digitally advanced private hospitals in Australia. We offer secure access to patient information via our SanCare electronic medical record, our award-winning Sancare mobile app, and remote access to most San clinical systems. Sydney Clinical School of ANU

Sydney Adventist Hospital has been involved in teaching medical students since 2000, with the Sydney Adventist Hospital Clinical School being formally established in 2011, in conjunction with the University of Sydney until December 2020. In 2013 the Clinical School moved into a purpose-built facility with large auditoria, teaching rooms, clinical laboratories, and a simulation centre.

Since 2021 SAH has partnered with the Australian National University Medical School. We strongly encourage all AMOs to become involved in teaching, which may include delivering formal lectures, facilitating PBLs, bedside teaching on the wards, hosting students in your consulting rooms, and teaching during procedures in the operating theatres.

San Clinical Trials Unit (CTU)

Research

SAH encourages doctors to be involved with research. The Research Office, and Director of Research (A/Prof Geoff Herkes), aim to promote research collaborations and effective working relationships within the Hospital, with other university and research entities, key stakeholders, consumer organisations and the community.

The Research Advisory Committee (RAC) – with representatives from all major clinical specialties, the Australasian Research Institute, Medical School, Executive Team, Allied Health, Rehabilitation, San Radiology and Nuclear Medicine and San Foundation – meets quarterly. Researchers can reach out to the RAC to network, seek advice and present their research at a meeting.

Case Managers

Case Managers can assess the needs of patients beyond hospitalisation and, if required, will ensure patients are connected with the appropriate services to continue the care needed. Case Managers have a vast knowledge of community resources and will ensure appropriate referrals to community health services and other organisations. Case Managers can be contacted via the inpatient wards.

Patient Navigators

Patient Navigators can assist patients to navigate a pathway through the health care system to ensure they have access to quality care, information and support. They can coordinate services and facilitate multidisciplinary care, with a focus on team work. The SAH oncology navigators currently cover breast (M: 0437 674 881), gastrointestinal (M: 0429 024 926), prostate (M: 0419 885 536), and gynaecology (M: 0409 226 620).

Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) Meetings

Multidisciplinary cancer teams are currently in place at the San for Breast Cancer, Urological Cancer, Lung Cancer, Gynaecological Cancer, Gastrointestinal Cancer, Prostate Cancer, Haematological Cancer, Melanoma, Sarcoma and Surgical Oncology, Head and Neck Cancer, Neuro-oncology and Endocrine Cancer. Patient Support Services

Cancer Support Centre

Pharmacy



A Clinical Pharmacy service is provided from Monday to Friday, 0800-1600 and a limited service for discharging patients on Saturdays. The dispensary is open Monday to Friday, 0800-2030, Saturday 0830-1600 and Sunday 0900-1600. An on-call Pharmacist is available after hours if needed. There is a retail pharmacy open to staff and the public on Level 4. Staff discounts are offered.

The clinical service includes medicine reconciliation, medication reviews, counselling and medication advice across most areas. Pharmacists prioritise patients at highest risk of medication misadventure.

Currently, pharmacists prepare the majority of Medication Discharge Summaries for patients. On Saturday mornings a limited service is provided between 0800 and 1200 to facilitate patient discharges however they are not able to see every discharging patient. Outside of usual pharmacy hours it is the responsibility of the AMO to complete patients' discharge summaries, including medication changes.

If notified in advance, the Ward Pharmacist can prepare medication discharge summaries on a Friday and make them electronically available for the AMO to finalise, along with the medical discharge summary, to ensure this documentation is available for patients on weekends.

San Radiology and Nuclear Medicine



San Radiology and Nuclear Medicine (SRNM) provides a comprehensive diagnostic and nuclear imaging and interventional radiology service, performing more than 91,000 examinations and procedures a year. SRNM is particularly well known for its breast, prostate and cardiac imaging programs which apply multi-modality correlation (Diagnostic Radiology and Nuclear Medicine/PET-CT) and subspecialty reporting to deliver the highest level of care for our patients.

SRNM operates across three locations (see table below), which includes dedicated outpatient imaging at Parkway San Clinic located opposite the Hospital campus.

Doctor parking


